

COMPLETION REPORT GUIDELINES

The title of the grant and "LGMD2i Research Fund" should be added to the header.

Page number and date should be included in footer.

I. SUMMARY _____ #

To be provided separately. Should be understandable by a nontechnical reader. Should not be longer than 2 pages. In the conclusion, medical implications, next steps, and new (unexpected) findings should be included.

II. EXPECTED OUTCOMES COMPARED TO ACTUAL OUTCOMES _____ #

Each of the original aims and objectives of the project will be clearly reassessed and their success or lack thereof will be clearly stated and explained. Maximum 2 pages.

III. VARIATIONS _____ #

Changes in the methods and experimental design over the original proposal will be described and the reasons of the changes will be explained. Maximum 1 page.

IV. RESULTS _____ #

The section should include the most critical data with nontechnical take-home conclusions. The exhaustive data set, side points, and discussion should be added in appendix A. Maximum 4 pages.

V. NEXT STEPS _____ #

In view of the results described above, a brief description of a resultant project should be provided. Maximum 1 page.

VI. APPENDICES _____ #

There is no restriction to the number of pages included in the appendices.

A. DATA _____ #

Description of the materials and methods should not be included in the legends of tables and graphs. M&M should be described separately.

B. PUBLICATIONS _____ #

Manuscripts expected to be written, in preparation, submitted for publication, accepted for publication, in press, or published should be listed in this section.

C. NEW INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY _____ #

This appendix will list new applications to gain intellectual property rights expected to be files or filed based on the outcome of current project.

D. EXPENSE REPORT _____ #
